On the occasion of the centenary of Romano Guardini's work "Der Gegensatz", the conference aims to address the crisis of thinking and to investigate the possible relevance of "thinking in contrapositions" (*Denken in Gegensätzen*) from a theological, spiritual and interreligious perspective, as well as from a philosophical one, together with experts and students. In this work, Guardini outlines the theoretical and hermeneutic foundation of his epistemology, whereby two contrapositions (*Gegensätze*) constitute dynamically a tension in a space of relation. In contemplative knowledge (*Anschauung*), one form of knowing beyond thinking, the contrapositions, unmixed and unseparated, form a unit in tension. In his works on the great figures of thinking (*Denkergestalten*), he calls the exercise of thinking the asceticism of thinking (*Askese des Denkens*). In the context of his philosophy of the living-concrete, Guardini understands *metánoia* as a change of sense (*Um-Sinnung*). Based on his reflections, the figures of Socrates, Buddha and Christ, each of whom, in a different yet related way, represents a change of sense in life and thinking, will be evaluated as examples. The conference ends with a day of "Applied Thinking" in which the students evaluate the forms of thinking in "contrapositions" in the context of their own scientific research.

**L'arte del pensare e della contemplazione**

In occasione del centenario dell'opera di Romano Guardini "Der Gegensatz", il convegno si propone di affrontare la crisi del pensare e di indagare la possibile attualità del "pensare in contrapposizioni" (*Denken in Gegensätzen*) da un punto di vista teologico, spirituale, interreligioso e filosofico, insieme ad esperti e studenti. In quest'opera, Guardini elabora la prospettiva teoretica ed ermeneutica della sua epistemologia, nella quale le contrapposizioni costituiscono dinamicamente una tensione in uno spazio relazionale. Nella conoscenza contemplativa (*Anschauung*), al di là del pensare, le contrapposizioni formano un'unità senza essere né separate né confuse. Nelle sue opere sulle grandi figure del pensiero (*Denkergestalten*), Guardini definisce l'esercizio del pensare come ascesi del pensare (*Askese des Denkens*). Nel contesto della sua filosofia del concreto vivente, concepisce la *metánoia* come *Um-Sinnung*, cioè come una svolta di senso. Muovendo da queste riflessioni, saranno considerate esemplarmente le figure di Socrate, Buddha e Cristo, le quali rappresentano, in modi diversi e tuttavia affini, il processo di una svolta di senso della vita e del pensare. Il convegno si concluderà con una giornata dedicata al "pensare applicato", in cui gli studenti valuteranno le forme del pensare in contrapposizioni nel contesto della propria ricerca scientifica.


